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STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT: 100% of state-mandated AYP goals will be met for all critical subgroups of students, including English Language Learners.

Maureen DeLuca	Imagine Learning	<p>ILT would like to pilot Imagine Learning. ILT proposing for all Kinder and 1st graders and ILT classes to pilot. Dr. DeLuca shared that the amount for Imagine Learning is \$30K for 370 students (all K-1, ILT classes, and EL's from MCLA). Dr. DeLuca shared that it is \$40K for unlimited licenses for one school year. Leadership had some questions about the program and had some discussion around Imagine Learning. Discussed the probable need for head-phones. Leadership Council members discussed the need for Imagine Learning given the needs of our English Learners. Leadership Council approved the expense of the full sight license for Imagine Learning Program.</p>	<p>Over the past several years we have looked at Imagine Learning as a resource for our English Learners. Some classes have piloted the program in the past. Our English Learners make consistent progress; Imagine Learning continues to come up as a research based, effective intervention tool.</p>	ILT members	Schedule a training for ILE and implementation plan.
